PLAST WINNIPEG 2022 Summer Camp Protocols:

We are excited to be welcoming campers back this summer, but understand the great importance of keeping our children, volunteers, and community safe. We continue to look towards public health to develop operating protocols that reflect the current state of the pandemic. Please note that our response plan is a living document and any changes or updates to our protocols will be communicated to our campers and families. Below, you will find some key points to our COVID-19 Response Plan that have been established with consideration from Scouts Canada, Manitoba and Ontario Camping Associations. We feel that these protocols will provide added protection from COVID-19 without taking away from your child's camp experience. We will:

- 1. Implement pre-arrival protocols, arrival, health screening & testing protocols to minimize the risk of COVID-19 entering camp.
- 2. Follow the latest public health recommendations for vaccinations status and health practices to minimize the risk of community spread while at camp.
- 3. Increase our onsite sanitation and cleaning procedures.
- 4. Enforce a response plan in the event of COVID-19 symptoms/case at camp.
- 5. Establish procedures for symptomatic campers and for potential onsite COVID-19 cases.

*Note: this document will use the term "camper" to refer to all participants attending camp

Vaccinations:

All people staying at camp will be required to be double vaccinated. Plast will require every camper to disclose their vaccination status by June 30, 2022. Any individuals other than campers (e.g. volunteer, guest, contractor, or occasional worker) who is not vaccinated or has an unknown status will be required to take a rapid test upon arrival and adhere to enhanced restrictions, including masking in all indoor public spaces and frequent rapid testing.

<u>Masking</u>:

Masks provide added protection not only from COVID-19, but other airborne viruses. For this reason, Plast will have masks as a part of the packing list. For campers, wearing a mask will be optional in any outdoor spaces as well as indoor shared spaces. Campers will only be required to wear masks if they become symptomatic or deemed a close contact with someone who is symptomatic or tests positive. All visitors will be required to wear masks in all indoor public spaces. Parents are asked to wear a mask when entering the cabin for set-up and clean-up.

Rapid Testing:

Rapid testing is a great defence to minimize the potential of COVID-19 entering camp. Before camp, we strongly recommend all campers take a rapid test the morning of departure. Rapid Antigen Tests are available from most pharmacies located in Sobeys, Walmart, Safeway, Shopper's Drug Mart, Save On Foods and Rexall. A rapid test will be used for symptomatic campers or a camper who might be considered a close contact (more information on symptomatic campers below).

1. Pre-Arrival & Screening:

Prior to arrival, all campers must complete a Camper Screening and Agreement form. Before arriving onsite, a self-assessment for symptoms of COVID-19 must be completed. If you are experiencing any of the symptoms on the checklist, please stay at home and contact the Camp Director. In the (14) days leading up to camp, we ask that you reduce any high-risk social interactions as much as possible and strictly adhere to the current public health guidelines and recommendations.

Camper Screening Agreement.

2. Daily Health Screening Protocol

- Daily Health Screening will take place each morning as part of the daily routine.
- Campers will be individually asked if any symptoms are present.

3. Response Plan in the Event of COVID Symptons/Case at Camp

If a camper starts to show signs or symptoms of COVID-19, the following steps will be taken:

- O The camper will be immediately isolated in a designated location. Once isolated, the designated on-site camp parent will determine if the symptoms are a potential sign of COVID-19 or if it is a symptom of a pre-existing condition.
- A rapid antigen test will be administered by the camp parent. In the case of a positive test result, the parent/guardian of the individual will be contacted immediately.
- At the discretion of the camp director and camp parent, the camper may need to isolate for 24 hours and be closely monitored. A second rapid test will be administered the following day if symptoms continue.
- Due to the long isolation period, campers who test positive for COVID-19 will be required to leave camp.
- Obsignated team will conduct a thorough cleaning of the spaces where the symptomatic person was and campers will be moved to a different location.
- In the case of a negative test with symptomatic conditions, the camper will be tested for three consecutive days to rule out or confirm the camper's ability to remain at camp.

4. Additional Safety Protocols for In-Camp Period

Plast has created a number of sanitation stations throughout the camp. Hand sanitizer can be found at the entrance of every building and at each activity area. Plast has also created protocols to:

- ♦ Increase the frequency of cleaning/disinfection of washrooms.
- Ensure the continued availability of all equipment necessary for hygiene measures (soap, water, hand sanitizer, paper towel, tissues, and toilet paper).
- O Post signage of hygiene/handwashing best practices in public washrooms.
- Clean/disinfect all frequently touched surfaces (light switches, doorknobs, stall locks, toilet handles, sinks, etc.).
